

Wall Street on the Transquaking: A Bestpitch Heir and his Fortune, by Dr. Phil Hesser, 4 April 2012

The road from the Bucktown crossroads to the Bestpitch ferry was known as "Wall Street" a century ago, receiving its name from Jesse B. Wall and his wealth as owner of the Bestpitch store and much of the land around it. Join Phil Hesser when he traces the life and fortunes of Jesse Wall, heir to the Bestpitch lands, from an uncertain youth to a prosperous life as "postmaster, real estate agent, grocer and 'furman.'"

For over 35 years, Phil Hesser, Ph.D., taught history in several universities in the US and Africa and served as a program officer and director with the United Nations and the Academy for Educational Development. He now can be found teaching at Salisbury University, the Institute for Adult Learning of Chesapeake College, and the Academy for Lifelong Learning of the Chesapeake Maritime Museum; running the marshes with retrievers Duke, Bella, and Marshall; or working on *Blackwater: A Guide for Exploration, and Sitting in Limbo: Life and Livelihood on the Tumps of Chesapeake Bay.*
